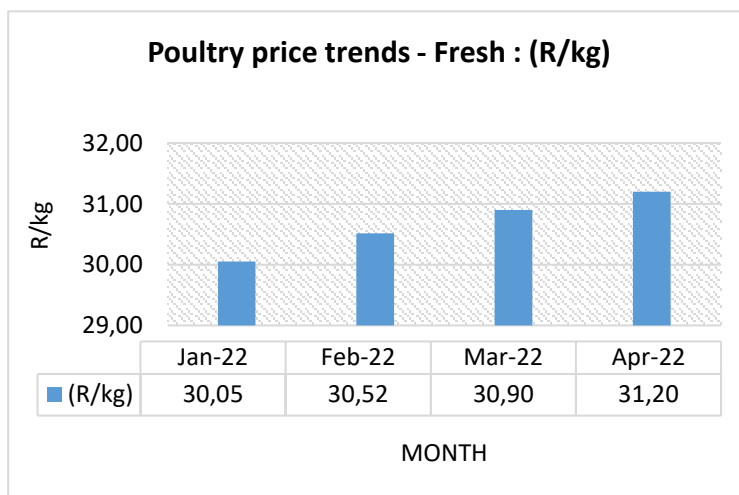
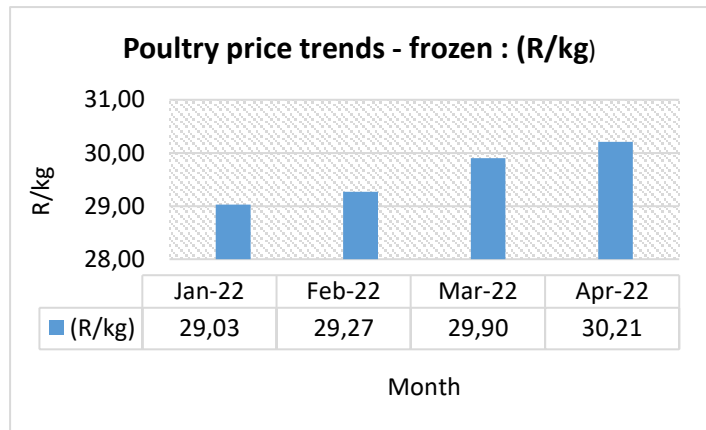
This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of poultry excluding value added tax.

During the reporting period, April 2022, average local poultry prices increased from prices recorded in March 2022. When comparing year-year prices, there is an increase in local poultry prices in April 2022 compared to the same period last year.

Frozen poultry Price trends

- In April 2022, the average price for frozen poultry was R30, 21 per kg, which is 1 % higher than in March 2022.
- Year on year average prices for Frozen poultry increased by 9, 7 % in April 2022 compared to April 2021.

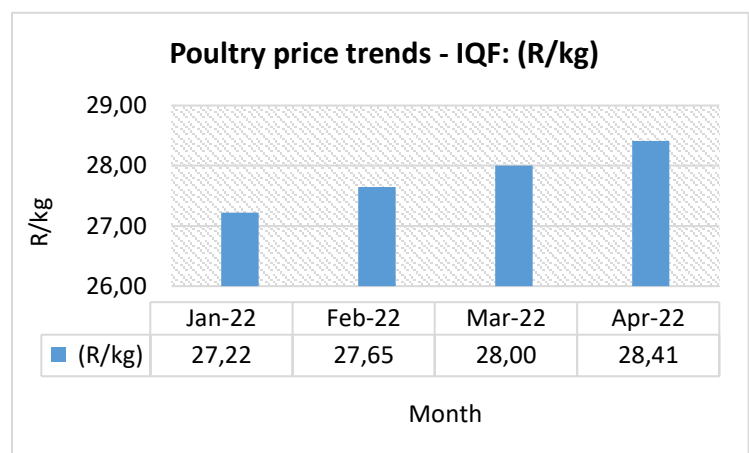


Fresh poultry Price trends

- In April 2022, the average price for Fresh poultry was R31, 20 per kg, which is 1 % higher than in March 2022.
- Year on year average prices for fresh poultry are showing an increase of 14 % between April 2021 and April 2022.

IQF Poultry Price trend

- During April 2022, average price for IQF poultry was R28, 41 per kg, which is a 1, 5 % price increase from March 2022.
- Year on year IQF poultry showed 7, 8 % average price increase compared to same period last year.
