

GOAT MONTHLY REPORT

This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of live goats excluding value added tax.

Table 1: Live goat- Average monthly producer selling prices (excluding VAT) in R/kg



During the reporting period, June 2022, average local prices for live goats (except for large goats) increased from prices recorded in May 2022. When comparing year on year prices, there was an increase in local goat prices (except for large goats) in June 2022 compared to the same period last year.



Large goat price trend

- In June 2022, the average price for a large goat was R44, 44 per kg, which is 1 % lower than in May 2022.
- Year on year average prices for a large goat decreased by 33 % in June 2022 compared to June 2021.





Medium goat price trend

- In June 2022, the average price for a medium goat was R56, 60 per kg, which is 9% higher than in May 2022.
- Year on year average prices for a medium goat show an increase of 3 % between June 2021 and June 2022.

Small goat price trend

- During June 2022, average price for a small goat was R61, 23 per kg, which is 0, 2% price decrease from May 2022.
- Year on year small goat showed a 41% average price increase compared to same period last year.





Live goat price trend (Ewes)

- In June 2022, the average price for ewes was R49, 01 per kg, which is 4% higher than in May 2022.
- Year on year average prices in June 2022 were 9 % higher than last year during the same period.
