

BEEF MONTHLY REPORT



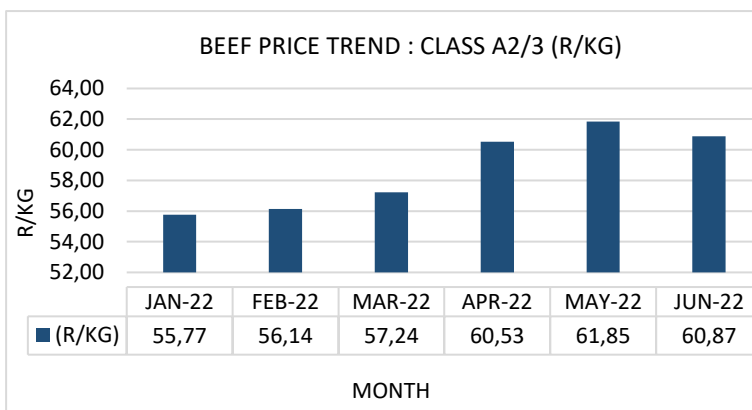

This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of beef and weaner calves excluding value added tax.

Table 1: Beef- Average monthly producer selling prices (excluding VAT) in R/kg

During the reporting period, June 2022, average local beef prices were lower than prices recorded in May 2022. When comparing year-year prices, there is an increase in local beef prices in June 2022 compared to the same period last year.

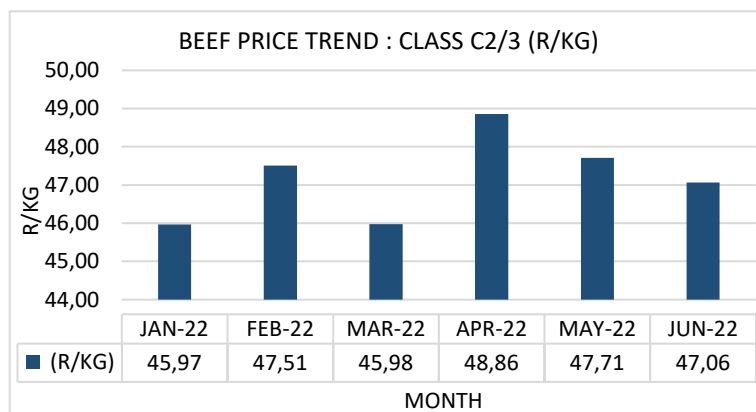
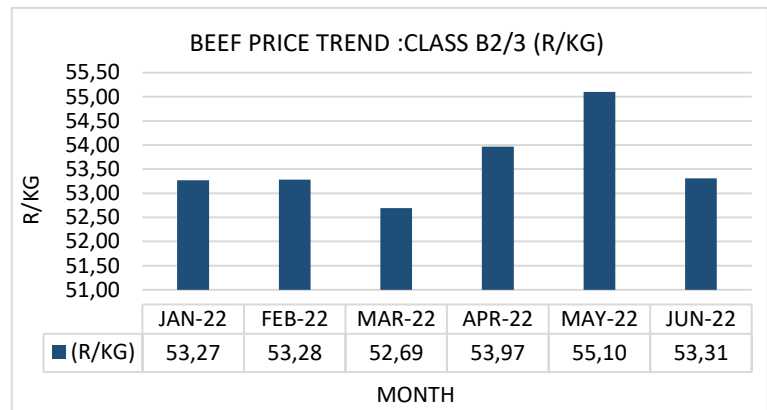


Beef Class A2/3 Price trend

- In June 2022, the average price for Class A beef was R60, 87 per kg which is 1, 57 % lower than in May 2022.
- Year on year average prices for Class A increased by 53,04 % in June 2022 compared to June 2021.

Beef Class B2/3 Price trend

- In June 2022, the average price for Class B was recorded to be R53, 31 per kg, which is 3, 24 % lower than in May 2022.
- Year on year average prices for Class B are showing an increase of 37, 43% between June 2021 and June 2022.

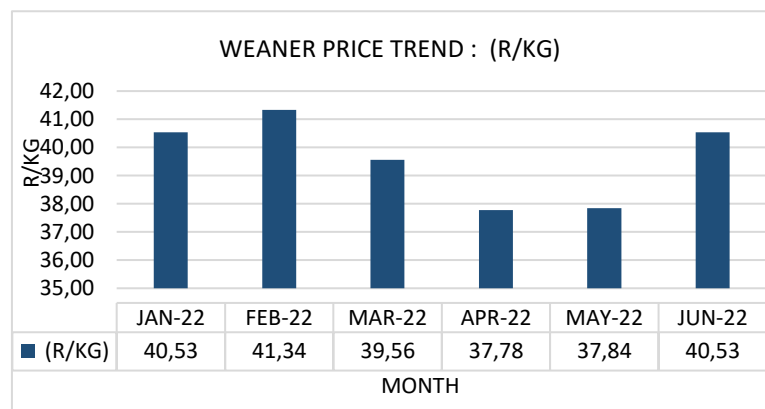


Beef Class C2/3 Price trend

- During June 2022, average price for class C beef was R47, 06 per kg, which is a 1, 35 % price decrease from May 2022.
- Year on year Class C beef showed 28,71% average price increase compared to same period last year.

Weaner Price trend

- In June 2022, the average price for weaner calves was R36, 60 per kg, which is 3, 27 % lower than in May 2022.
- Year on year average prices in June 2022 were 26, 93 % higher than last year during the same period.
