

GOAT MONTHLY REPORT

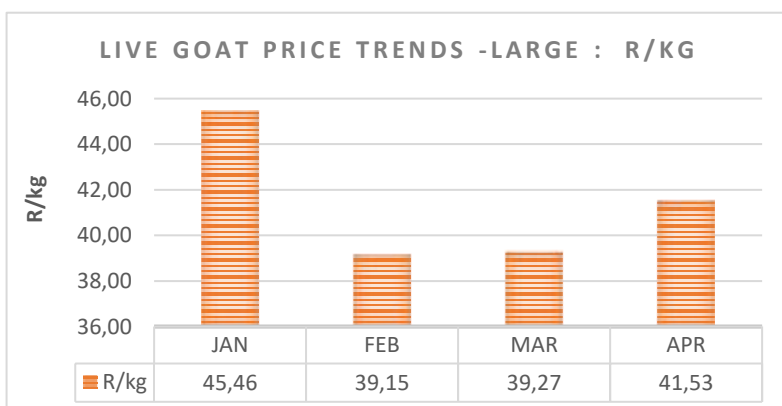


Issue: 2022/04

This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of live goats excluding value added tax.

During the reporting period, April 2022, average local prices for large and medium live goats increased from prices recorded in March 2022. On the other hand, average local prices small live goats and ewes decreased in April 2022 compared to March 2022. When comparing year on year prices, there was a decrease in local goat prices (except for large live goats) in April 2022 compared to the same period last year.

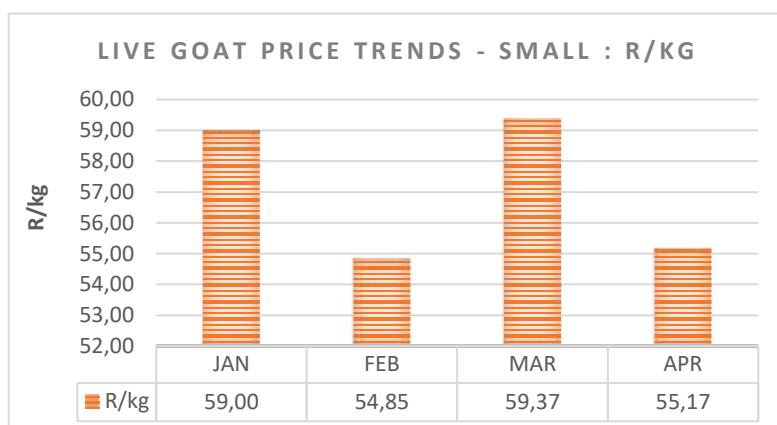
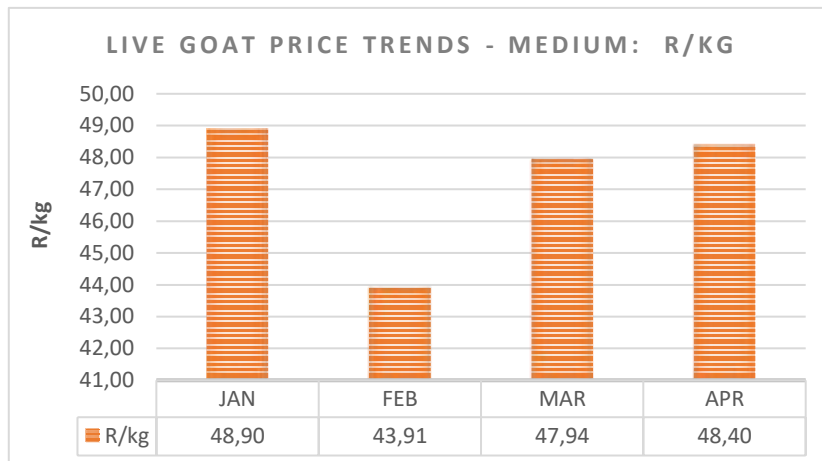


Large goat Price trend

- In April 2022, the average price for a large goat was R41, 53 per kg, which is 6 % higher than in March 2022.
- Year on year average prices for a large goat increased by 3% in April 2022 compared to April 2021.

Medium goat price trends

- In April 2022, the average price for a medium goat was R48, 40 per kg, which is 1 % higher than in March 2022.
- Year on year average prices for a medium goat show a decrease of 0,4% between April 2021 and April 2022.



Small goat Price trends

- During April 2022, average price for a small goat was R55, 17 per kg, which is a 7% price decrease from March 2022.
- Year on year small goat showed a 1 % average price decrease compared to same period last year.

Live goat price trends (Ewes)

- In April 2022, the average price for ewes was R38, 61 per kg, which is 13% lower than in March 2022.
- Year on year average prices in April 2022 were 8 % lower than last year during the same period.
