# POULTRY MONTHLY REPORT





This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of poultry excluding value added tax.

Table 1: Poultry - Average monthly producer selling prices (excluding VAT) in R/kg

Mar-22	29,90	30,90	28,00

During the reporting period, March 2023, average local poultry prices (except for Frozen) increased from prices recorded in February 2023. When comparing year-year prices, there is an increase in local poultry prices in March 2023 compared to the same period last year.





# Frozen poultry price trend

- o In March 2023, average price for Frozen poultry was R33, 08 per kg, which is 2% lower than in February 2023.
- Year on year average prices for Frozen poultry increased by 11 % in March 2023 compared to March 2022.

### Fresh poultry price trend

- o In March 2023, the average price for Fresh poultry was R33, 81 per kg, which is 0, 1 % higher than in February 2023.
- Year on year average prices for Fresh poultry are showing an increase of 9 % between March 2022 and March 2023.





# IQF poultry price trend

- O During March 2023, average price for IQF poultry was R32, 19 per kg, which is a 0, 2 % price increase from February 2023.
- Year on year IQF poultry showed 15 % average price increase compared to same period last year.
