Taking pet dogs to the United States of America

If your situation differs in any way from the proposed process, or if you have information from the veterinary authority of the importing country that differs from the process described below, please contact your local state veterinarian to discuss the matter.

Exporters are advised to verify the requirements of the importing country by contacting the veterinary authorities, or their representatives in South Africa, in advance of each consignment.

General Requirements:

- A health check within 5 days of travel (dogs).
- A valid rabies vaccination
 - ✓ All dogs vaccinated for rabies for the first time (ie. primary vaccinations) must be vaccinated at least 28 days prior to arrival.
 - ✓ Booster vaccinations have no waiting period. In the case where an adult dog (15 months or older) received a primary vaccination after 3 months of age that has since expired, they may receive a booster and then travel immediately without having to wait 30 days.
- Puppies must not be vaccinated against rabies before 3 months of age, the rabies certificates must include puppy's date of birth/age.
- A current, valid rabies vaccination certificate that includes the following information:*
 - o Name and address of owner.
 - Breed, sex, age, colour, markings, and other identifying information for the dog including the dog's microchip number.
 - o Date of rabies vaccination and vaccine product information.
 - Date the vaccination expires.
 - Name, license number, address, and signature of <u>veterinarian</u> who administered the vaccination.

^{*} Please note that beginning March 1, 2023, a valid CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record is the <u>only rabies vaccination certificate</u> that CDC will accept from dogs that were vaccinated outside of the United States. CDC will NOT accept foreign-issued pet passports or any other certificates for foreign rabies vaccinations, and any CDC Dog Import Permits or reservations at a CDC-approved animal care facility must also have a CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record attached. The CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record must be filled in completely and signed by the licensed

veterinarian who administered the vaccine. In the event the veterinarian that vaccinated the dog has left the practice, a second veterinarian may complete the record if:

- o A valid veterinary-client-patient relationship (VCPR) exists with the second veterinarian currently in the clinic in which the vaccinating veterinarian practiced medicine; and
- o The dog's information (breed, sex, age, microchip) and vaccination history can be verified using the clinic's existing medical records

According to the CDC:

Starting from June 10, 2022 the USA now has three options A, B or C when bringing your dog/s into their country from a high-risk country for rabies such as South Africa depending on where the dogs' rabies vaccinations were administered, and the number of dogs being imported. All dogs from high-risk countries must:

- 1. Appear healthy on arrival
- 2. Be at least 6 months old.
- 3. Have a valid <u>CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record</u> or U.S.-issued rabies vaccination certificate. Rules vary depending on whether the dog was vaccinated in the United States or in a foreign country (see Option A, B or C).
 - The rabies vaccine must be administered by a licensed veterinarian on or after 12 weeks of age and at least 28 days before arrival if it is the dog's first vaccination.
 - Booster rabies vaccines administered after 15 months of age are valid immediately.
- 4. Have an <u>ISO-compatible microchip</u> for identification listed on their rabies vaccination certificate or <u>CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record</u>.
- 5. Meet the requirements of either Option A, B, or C below.

Option A: The dog/s must have been vaccinated in the USA before they left the USA. A valid US-Issued rabies vaccination certificate (RVC). There is no limit to the number of dogs with valid US-issued rabies vaccination certificates. Your dog must:

- 1. Appear healthy on arrival
- 2. Be at least 6 months old
- 3. The rabies vaccine must be administered by a licensed veterinarian on or after 12 weeks of age and at least 28 days before arrival if it is the dog's first vaccination.
- 4. Booster rabies vaccines administered after 15 months of age are valid immediately.
- 5. Have an <u>ISO-compatible microchip</u> number listed on their rabies vaccination certificate
- 6. Be accompanied by a valid US-issued rabies vaccination certificate upon arrival

- o The rabies vaccine must be administered by a US-licensed veterinarian in the United States on or after 12 weeks of age and at least 28 days before arrival if it is the dog's first vaccination.
- Booster rabies vaccines administered in the United States after 15 months of age are valid immediately.
- 7. Arrive at one of the 18 airports with a CDC quarantine station:
 - Anchorage (ANC), Atlanta (ATL), Boston (BOS), Chicago (ORD), Dallas (DFW), Detroit (DTW), Honolulu (HNL), Houston (IAH), Los Angeles (LAX), Miami (MIA), Minneapolis (MSP), New York (JFK), Newark (EWR), Philadelphia (PHL), San Francisco (SFO), San Juan (SJU), Seattle (SEA), and Washington DC (IAD).
- Important Note: Expired US rabies vaccination certificates will NOT be accepted. If the US-issued rabies vaccination certificate has expired, you must enter using Option B or C (see below).

Option B: Apply for and obtain a valid CDC Dog Import Permit before arrival. CDC will only issue permits for 2 dogs per person during the suspension.

- You must apply online for a <u>CDC Dog Import Permit</u>. It is recommended to apply at least 8 weeks before intended travel. Before beginning the process, your dog must:
 - o Have a valid CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record
 - Have a valid rabies serologic titer from an <u>approved laboratory</u>. For dogs older than 15 months with booster vaccinations, make sure the <u>CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record</u> shows the current rabies vaccination and at least one previous rabies vaccination given when the dog was 12 weeks old or older if your dog's titer was collected less than 30 days from the date of the current rabies vaccination.
- 2. Arrive at one of the 18 airports with a CDC quarantine station:
 - Anchorage (ANC), Atlanta (ATL), Boston (BOS), Chicago (ORD), Dallas (DFW), Detroit (DTW), Honolulu (HNL), Houston (IAH), Los Angeles (LAX), Miami (MIA), Minneapolis (MSP), New York (JFK), Newark (EWR), Philadelphia (PHL), San Francisco (SFO), San Juan (SJU), Seattle (SEA), and Washington DC (IAD).

Important Note: Permits will not be issued at ports of entry. Appeals are not permitted.

Option C: For dogs without a US-issued rabies vaccination certificate or a CDC Dog Import Permit. Please note: This is the only option for persons importing 3 or more dogs into the United States.

- Appear healthy on arrival
- 2. Be at least 6 months old
- 3. Have an <u>ISO-compatible microchip</u> number listed on their rabies vaccination certificate

- 4. Be accompanied by a valid <u>CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record</u> upon arrival
 - The rabies vaccine must be administered by a licensed veterinarian on or after 12 weeks of age and at least 28 days before arrival if it is the dog's first vaccination.
 - Booster rabies vaccines administered after 15 months of age are valid immediately.
- 5. Make a reservation at one of the <u>CDC-approved animal care facilities</u> with necessary follow-up services** at importer's (owner's) expense.
- 6. The CDC-approved animal care facility will determine if the dog has a valid CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record and serology titer.
 - If invalid CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record: dog will be denied entry.
 - If valid CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record: CDC-approved facility will determine if the dog has a valid rabies serology titer***
 - If valid titer: Each dog must be examined and re-vaccinated with a USlicensed rabies vaccine by a USDA-accredited veterinarian at a CDCapproved animal care facility upon arrival at the importer's (owner's) expense.
 - If **invalid** titer or no titer: Each dog must have a reservation to quarantine at a CDC-approved animal care facility for 28 days after the exam and re-vaccination at the importer's (owner's) expense.
- Important Note: Option C is the only option for people with 3 or more foreign-vaccinated dogs. Dogs MUST enter at the airport associated with the CDC-approved animal care facility where they have a reservation, and the reservation MUST be made before arrival in the United States.

Additional USDA requirements:

- 1. Have been inspected for screwworm within 5 days prior to shipment to the United States and they are free from screwworm.
- 2. Their fur and bedding are free of excessive dirt, hay, or straw.

Procedure

• Your dog should be taken to your local private veterinarian for a health check.

^{**}Follow-up services (e.g., examination, re-vaccination, and possible 28-day quarantine) are at importer's (owner's) expense.

^{***}Titer must be from an approved lab drawn at least 45 days and no more than 1 year before arrival.

- Your veterinarian should complete a Veterinary Health Certificate (VHC) and CDC Rabies Vaccination and Microchip Record for the export of dogs from SA to the USA -Blank forms may be obtained from the State Veterinary (SV) office.
- The signed VHC as well as your dog's vaccination booklet, valid <u>CDC Rabies</u>
 <u>Vaccination and Microchip Record</u> and microchipping certificate (if applicable)
 should be brought to the SV office for certification. You should also have your driver's
 licence or ID book available.
- Certificate application cost can be found on the department's tariff list. Certificate is payable on appointment (Cost per application R200 each in 2023).
