# POULTRY MONTHLY REPORT





This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of poultry excluding value added tax.

Table 1: Poultry - Average monthly producer selling prices (excluding VAT) in R/kg.

During the reporting period, January 2024, average local poultry prices decreased from prices recorded in December 2023. When comparing year-year prices, there is an increase in local poultry prices in January 2024 compared to the same period last year.





# Frozen poultry price trend

- o In January 2024, average price for Frozen poultry was R37,97 per kg, which is 0,9 % lower than in December 2023.
- Year on year average prices for Frozen poultry increased by 15,6% in January 2024 compared to January 2023.

### Fresh poultry price trend

- In January 2024, the average price for Fresh poultry was R38,04 per kg, which is 1,7 % lower than in December 2023.
- Year on year average prices for Fresh poultry are showing an increase of 13,9 % between January 2023 and January 2024.





# IQF poultry price trend

- During January 2024, average price for IQF poultry was R33, 92 per kg, which is a 1 % price decrease from December 2023.
- Year on year IQF poultry showed 5,1 % average price increase compared to same period last year.
