Taking pet dogs and cats to Canada

If your situation differs in any way from the proposed process, or if you have information from the veterinary authority of the importing country that differs from the process described below, please contact your local state veterinarian to discuss the matter.

Exporters are advised to verify the requirements of the importing country by contacting the veterinary authorities, or their representatives in South Africa, in advance of each consignment.

Please note that South Africa is not rabies free when navigating the site.

<u>Requirements</u>

Canada recognises 6 categories of dogs and depending on the category in which your dog falls under, the necessary requirements are determined accordingly. There are two conditions for cats.

Canada does not require a waiting period between the time the animal is vaccinated for rabies and the time the animal is imported into Canada.

Dogs less than 3 months of age, accompanied by their owner

Proof of the dog's age (you get this from a veterinarian)

Dogs less than 3 months of age, unaccompanied by their owner

Proof of the dog's age (you get this from a veterinarian)

A veterinary health certificate

Dogs older than 3 months but less than 8 months of age, accompanied by their owner

Valid rabies vaccination certificate*

Dogs older than 3 months but less than 8 months of age, <u>unaccompanied</u> by their owner

Valid rabies vaccination certificate* AND

A veterinary health certificate

Dogs <u>less</u> than 8 months of age travelling for commercial purposes

- Veterinary certificates of health and kennel of origin certificates: An official veterinarian must certify that the dog(s) was/were born in the kennel of origin and that the kennel meets the specific animal health criteria. The dog(s) must be vaccinated against rabies before export to Canada. They must be at least 3 months of age at the time of vaccination and there is a 28 day waiting period after vaccination before the animal is eligible for export. This means that dogs must be at least 16 weeks of age at the time of export. The dog(s) must be treated for internal and external parasites prior to export. The dog(s) has/have been vaccinated against canine distemper, canine adenovirus 2 (hepatitis), canine parainfluenza, and canine parvovirus, with vaccines licensed and approved for that purpose in the country of origin.
- Rabies certificate*
- A microchip.
- An import permit.

Commercial dogs brought into Canada would fall under one of these categories:

- dogs for resale
- dogs for breeding purposes, not for direct retail sale
- dogs for show or exhibition
- dogs for scientific research
- dogs for adoption or destined for an animal welfare organization in Canada
- dogs in special "training status"
- Canadian commercial dogs returning to Canada

Dogs more than 8 months of age

Valid rabies vaccination certificate*

Cats less than 3 months of age

Proof of the cat's age (you get this from a veterinarian)

Cats more than 3 months of age

^{*}What is a Rabies certificate?

- Written in English or French.
- Issued and signed by a licensed veterinarian.
- Identifies the animal (as in breed, colour, and weight).
- State that the animal is vaccinated against rabies.
- Indicate the date of vaccination.
- Indicate the trade name and the serial number of the licensed vaccine; and
- Specify the duration of immunity (otherwise, it will be considered valid for one year from the date of vaccination).

If you have had your pet vaccinated by a registered veterinarian, then the book or certificate they provide you as proof of this vaccination should meet all these requirements but please check this if you are unsure.

Procedure if you require a Veterinary Health Certificate (VHC) in order to travel

- Your veterinarian should complete a standard VHC. Blank forms may be obtained from the state vet (SV) office or the Elsenburg.com website.
- The signed VHC as well as your pet's vaccination booklet and microchipping certificate (if applicable) should be brought to the SV office for certification. You should also have your driver's licence or ID book available.
- Certificate application cost can be found on the department's tariff list. Certificate is payable on appointment (Cost per application R200 each in 2023).
