

# GOAT MONTHLY REPORT



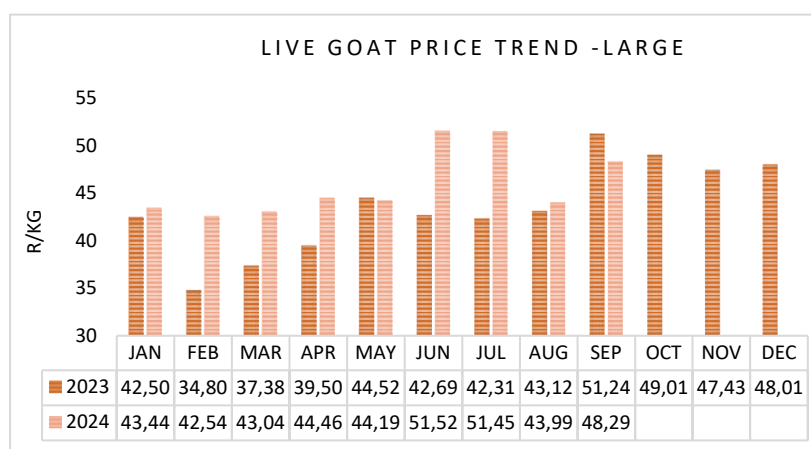

This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of live goats excluding value added tax.

Table 1: Live goat- Average monthly producer selling prices (excluding VAT) in R/kg.

During the reporting period, September 2024, average local prices for live goats increased from prices recorded in August 2024. When comparing year on year prices, there was an increase in local goat prices (except for Large goats) in September 2024 compared to September 2023.

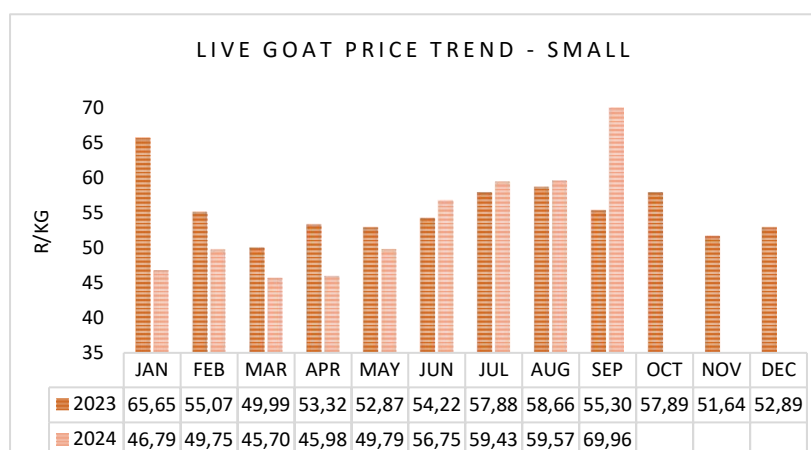
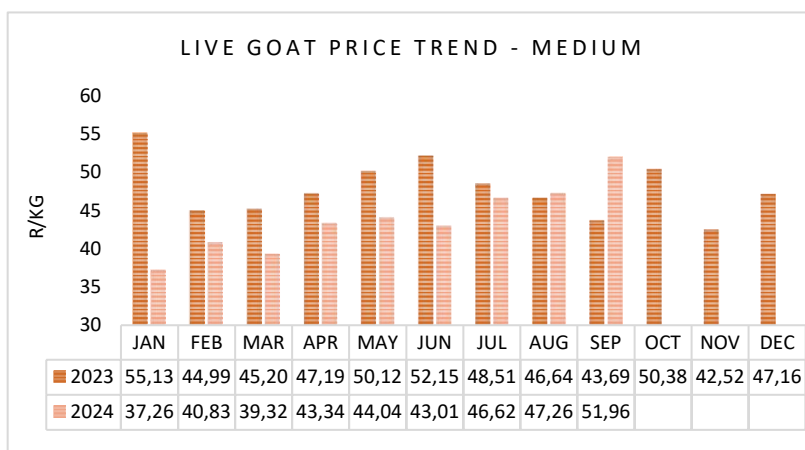


## Large goat price trend

- In September 2024, the average price for a large goat was R48,29 per kg, which is 9,8% higher than in August 2024.
- Large goat prices decreased by 5,8 % in September 2024 compared to September 2023.

## Medium goat price trend

- In September 2024, the average price for a medium goat was R51,96 per kg, which is 9,9% higher than in August 2024.
- Year on year average prices for a medium goat show an increase of 18,9% between September 2023 and September 2024.

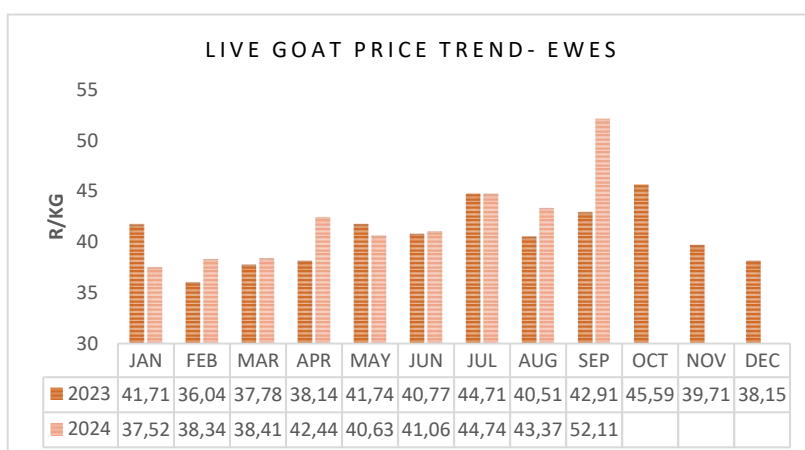


## Small goat price trend

- During September 2024, average price for a small goat was R69,96 per kg, which is a 17,4% price increase from August 2024.
- Year on year small goat prices showed a 26,5% average price increase compared to the same period last year.

## Live goat price trend (Ewes)

- In September 2024, the average price for ewes was R52,11 per kg, which is 20,2 % higher than in August 2024.
- Year on year average prices in September 2024 were 21,5 % higher than the previous year during the same period.
