

This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of poultry excluding value added tax.

Table 1: Poultry - Average monthly producer selling prices (excluding VAT) in R/kg.

During the reporting period, January 2025, average local poultry prices increased (except for frozen) from prices recorded in December 2024. When comparing year-year prices, there is a decrease in local poultry prices in January 2025 compared to the same period last year.





Frozen poultry price trend

- o In January 2025, average price for Frozen poultry was R32,85 per kg, which is 2,8% lower than in December 2024.
- Year on year average prices for Frozen poultry decreased by 13,5% in January 2025 compared to January 2024.

Fresh poultry price trend

- In January 2025, the average price for Fresh poultry was R37,33 per kg, which is 6,1% higher than in December 2024.
- Year on year average prices for Fresh poultry are showing a decrease of 1,9% between January 2024 and January 2025.





IQF poultry price trend

- During January 2025, average price for IQF poultry was R33, 07 per kg, which is a 0,6% price increase from December 2024.
- Year on year IQF poultry showed a 2,5% average price decrease compared to same period last year.
