

# **BEEF MONTHLY REPORT**




## Issue: 2025/03

This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of beef and weaner calves excluding value added tax.

During the reporting period, March 2025, average local beef prices were lower (except for class B and Class C) than prices recorded in the previous month. March 2025 local beef prices show an increase compared to the same period last year.




### Beef Price trend: Class A2/3


 In March 2025, the average price for Class A beef was R56,25 per kg, which is 1,2% higher than in February 2025.

Year on year average prices for
Class A increased by 3,2% in March
2025 compared to March 2024.

#### Beef Price trend: Class B2/3

- In March 2025, the average price for Class B was R49,97 per kg, which is 0,9% lower than in February 2025.
- Year on year average prices for Class B are showing an increase of 6,4% between March 2025 and March 2024.






#### Beef Price trend: Class C2/3

 During March 2025, average price for class C beef was R47,03 per kg, which is 1,4% lower than the previous month.

Year on year Class C beef showed
 3% average price increase
 compared to the same period last
 year.

#### Weaner Price trend

- In March 2025, the average price for weaner calves was R34,33 per kg, which is 0,8% higher than in February 2025.
- Year on year average prices in March 2025 were 5,6 % higher than last year during the same period.
