

# GOAT MONTHLY REPORT



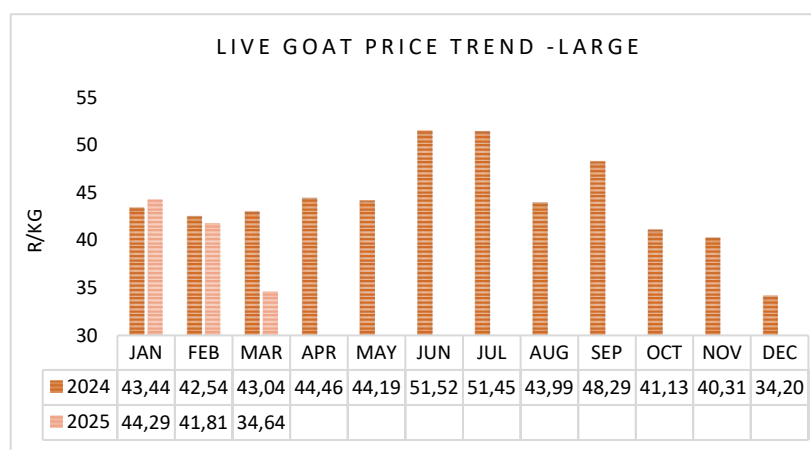
**Issue: 2025/03**

This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of live goats excluding value added tax.

Table 1: Live goat- Average monthly producer selling prices (excluding VAT) in R/kg.

During the reporting period, March 2025, average local prices for live goats decreased (except for small goats and Ewes prices) from prices recorded in February 2025. When comparing year on year prices, there was an increase (except for large goat prices) in local goat prices in March 2025 compared to March 2024.



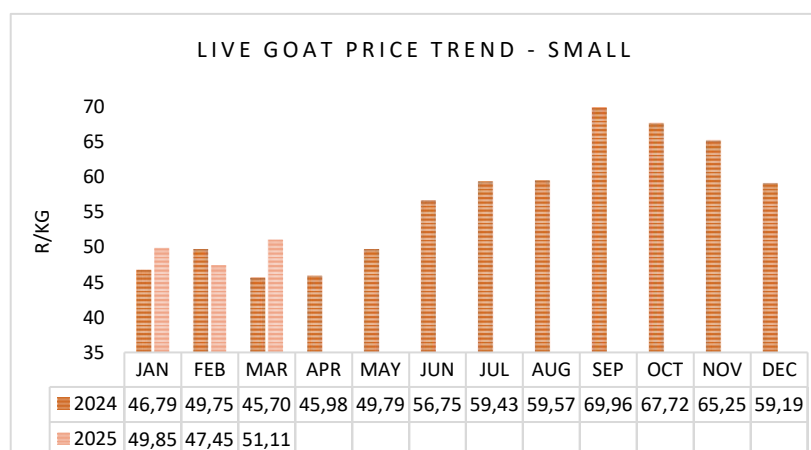
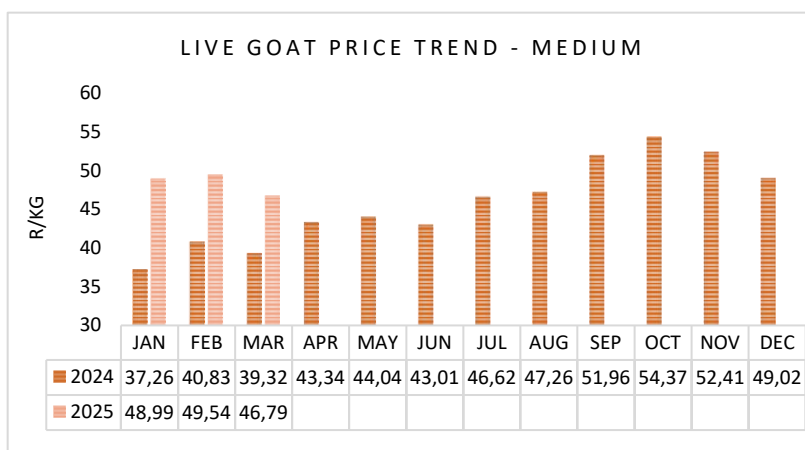
## Large goat price trend

○ In March 2025, the average price for a large goat was R34,64 per kg, which is 17,2% lower than in February 2025.

○ Large goat prices decreased by 19,5% in March 2025 compared to March 2024.

## Medium goat price trend

- In March 2025, the average price for a medium goat was R46,79 per kg, which is 5,5% lower than in February 2025.
- Year on year average prices for a medium goat show an increase of 19% between March 2024 and March 2025.

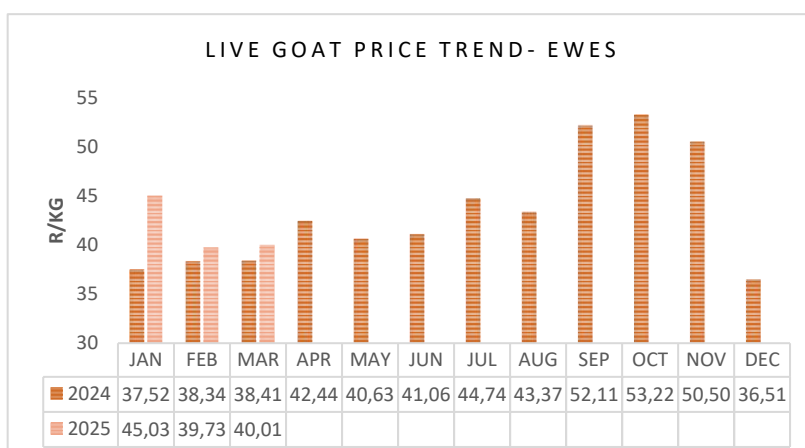


## Small goat price trend

- During March 2025, average price for a small goat was R51,11 per kg, which is a 7,7% price increase from February 2025.
- Year on year small goat prices showed a 11,8% average price increase compared to the same period last year.

## Live goat price trend (Ewes)

- In March 2025, the average price for ewes was R40,01 per kg, which is 0,7% higher than in February 2025.
- Year on year average prices in March 2025 were 4,1% higher than the previous year during the same period.
