FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (FMD) FACTSHEET

For Agricultural Shows in the Western Cape - June 2025

1. WHAT IS FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE?

Foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) is a **highly contagious viral illness** affecting cloven-hoofed animals like cattle, sheep, goats, and pigs. It causes:

- Painful blisters in the mouth and around the hooves
- Lameness and drooling
- Reduced appetite and movement
- Long-term economic losses
- National trade restrictions

2. INCUBATION AND RISK

- Incubation period: 2-14 days animals can appear healthy but still be infectious.
- The disease spreads quickly via animal movement, contaminated clothing and equipment, and transport vehicles.
- Outbreaks have been confirmed recently in KwaZulu-Natal, Gauteng, and Mpumalanga.
- The Western Cape remains FMD-free we must keep it that way.

3. LEGAL AND BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENTS FOR AGRICULTURAL SHOWS

To protect our province and participants, strict compliance is required.

3.1 BEFORE THE SHOW

a) Origin/Owner Declaration Form

- Every animal must be accompanied by this form indicating its origin and health status.
- Available on the Elsenburg Animal Health page: www.elsenburg.com/veterinary-services/animal-health-and-disease-control/#Situation
- b) Veterinary Certificate (strongly recommended)
 - Issued by a private veterinarian confirming the animals are clinically healthy.
 - Template available online.

c) Avoid high-risk animals

• Do not bring animals from restricted or outbreak areas (e.g. in KZN, MP, GP). You will be held liable under the Animal Diseases Act if you spread disease.

3.2 DURING THE SHOW

- No contact between animals from different farms.
- Avoid shared handling of animals by people from different farms.
- Provide footbaths and disinfectant stations (disinfectant list below) for people and equipment.
- Disinfect tools, pens, and vehicles regularly.

3.3 AFTER THE SHOW

a) Buyer/Destination Declaration Form

• Animals leaving the show must be accompanied by this form signed by the receiving party, stating that the mandatory 28-day quarantine will be observed.

b) Mandatory 28-Day Quarantine

- All animals must be **isolated for 28 days** on return or arrival at a new farm, regardless of veterinary clearance.
- This has been a legal requirement since October 2022.
- You will be held liable under the Animal Diseases Act if you spread disease.

c) Clean and Disinfect

All vehicles, equipment, and trailers used at the show must be disinfected before returning to the farm.

4. IF YOU SUSPECT FMD

- Immediately report any suspicion (excessive salivation, mouth blisters, lameness) to your local State Veterinarian.
- Do not move the animal or allow further contact.

5. SUMMARY OF YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

Stakeholder	Key Responsibilities			
Show organisers	Ensure forms are submitted, pens are managed, and hygiene is enforced.			
Animal owners	Bring healthy animals, provide documentation, isolate animals post-show, avoin risky purchases.			
Buyers	Agree to quarantine new animals and monitor for symptoms.

FMD is not just an agricultural concern — it's a **national biosecurity issue**. Let's work together to keep our province free from disease.

6. DISINFECTANTS EFFECTIVE AGAINST FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE VIRUS

Active Ingredient	Trade/common name example	Concentration for FMDV (%)	Contact time (minutes)	Important to note
Sodium hydroxide	Caustic soda	2	10	Add powder to water and not water to powder. Corrosive.
Sodium carbonate	Soda ash	4	10	Mildly corrosive.

Active Ingredient	Trade/common name example	Concentration for FMDV (%)	Contact time (minutes)	Important to note
Citric acid		3	Porous surfaces: 30 min. Non-porous surfaces: 15 min	Clean well before applying.
Acetic acid	Household vinegar (4- 8% acetic acid)	2	10	Clean well before applying.
Sodium hypochlorite (NaClO)	Household bleach (approx. 3% sodium hypochlorite in South Africa)	0.3	Porous surfaces: 30 min. Non-porous surfaces: 15 min.	Use immediately after mixing the solution. Add NaClO to water. Corrosive.
Potassium peroxymono- sulphate	Virkon S	1	10
