- Final selection and programme offers will only be confirmed in January 2026, once all applicants are ranked according to their final Admission Score (AS) and programme requirements.

 January 2026.
- The final selection period will take place immediately after the official release of the 2025
 National Senior Certificate results.

3. Confirmation of Admission

Admission will only be confirmed during registration upon submission of the following:

- Original Grade 12 Certificate/Statement of Results
- Identity Document

For **International Students**, you are required to submit the following documentation on the day of registration:

- All school leaving results/academic records
- A SAQA evaluation for international qualifications
- A study permit (receipts will not be accepted) made out for the Elsenburg Agricultural
 Training Institute.
- Your passport
- Proof of comprehensive medical aid cover (valid for 12 months) and valid in South

 Africa
- All fees charged for the year must be paid in full before or on the day of registration.

Note: If you do not meet the minimum admission requirements at registration, you will not be admitted.

4. Step-by-Step Registration Process

Step 1: Academic Clearance

All required documentation must be verified before registration can proceed.

Step 2: Fees and Payment

- A compulsory first instalment of R6 130.00, which includes a registration fee of R3
 297.00, is payable on or before 28 February. Failure to make this payment by the due
 date will result in deregistration and the deactivation of student access.
- Students funded by NSFAS or an approved bursary may be provisionally registered while their funding is being verified. Final registration will be confirmed once funding approval has been received.

Step 3: Proof of registration

Once you have been registered, you will receive:

- Proof of Registration
- Statement of Account

Note: Please check that you are registered for the correct modules. Changes must be completed before the amendment deadline (13 February 2026). If you fail to make corrections before the amendment cut-off dates, you will be liable for the fees, and the modules concerned will appear on your academic record as a FAIL.

Step 4: Student Card and Biometric Access

• Once you have obtained your proof of registration, please proceed to the Hostel

Dining Hall to collect your student card and register on the access control system.

• Students registering for the B.Agric programme who require a Stellenbosch University

student card may purchase the card through Stellenbosch University. This fee is

payable directly to Stellenbosch University.

Step 5: Hostel Registration

Once you have concluded the academic registration, hostel students may report to the

Hostel Dining Hall for the allocation of their rooms. Proof of registration must be presented to

the hostel before a student may be allocated to a room.

Note: The onus is on the student to confirm, before registration, whether he/she has received

a place in the hostel.
