

POULTRY MONTHLY REPORT





This report provides price trends in the South African livestock market. It provides average monthly producer selling prices (R/kg) of poultry excluding value added tax.

Table 1: Poultry - Average monthly producer selling prices (excluding VAT) in R/kg.

During the reporting period, November 2025, average local poultry prices increased (except for Fresh and IQF poultry) from prices recorded in October 2025. When comparing year-year prices, there is an increase in local poultry prices in November 2025 compared to the same period last year.





Frozen poultry price trend

- o In November 2025, the average price for Frozen poultry was R35,38 per kg, which is 1,6% higher than in October 2025
- Year on year average prices for Frozen poultry increased by 7% in November 2025 compared to November 2024.

Fresh poultry price trend

- In November 2025, the average price for Fresh poultry was R40,74 per kg, which is 0,1% lower than in October 2025.
- Year on year average prices for Fresh poultry are showing an increase of 18,9% between November 2024 and November 2025.





IQF poultry price trend

- O During November 2025, the average price for IQF poultry was R35, 40 per kg, which is a 0,9% price decrease from October 2025.
- Year on year IQF poultry showed an 11.7% average price increase compared to same period last year.
